Bennett, 2016-06-28 Religion and the Rise of Jim Crow in New Orleans examines a difficult chapter in American religious history the story of race prejudice in American Christianity Focusing on the largest city in the late nineteenth century South it explores the relationship between churches black and white Protestant and Catholic and the emergence of the Jim Crow laws statutes that created a racial caste system in the American South The book fills a gap in the scholarship on religion and race in the crucial decades between the end of Reconstruction and the eve of the Civil Rights movement Drawing on a range of local and personal accounts from the post Reconstruction period newspapers and church records Bennett's analysis challenges the assumption that churches fell into fixed patterns of segregation without a fight In sacred no less than secular spheres establishing Jim Crow constituted a long slow and complicated journey that extended well into the

twentieth century Churches remained a source of hope and a means of resistance against segregation rather than a retreat from racial oppression Especially in the decade after Reconstruction churches offered the possibility of creating a common identity that privileged religious over racial status a pattern that black church members hoped would transfer to a national American identity transcending racial differences Religion thus becomes a lens to reconsider patterns for racial interaction throughout Southern society By tracing the contours of that hopeful yet ultimately tragic journey this book reveals the complex and mutually influential relationship between church and society in the American South placing churches at the center of the nation's racial struggles

Waterfront Workers of New Orleans Eric Arnesen, 1994 During the nineteenth century American and foreign travelers often found New Orleans a delightful exotic stop on their journeys few failed to marvel at the riverfront the center of the city's economic activity But absent from the tourism industry's historical recollection is any reference to the immigrants or black migrants and their children who constituted the army of laborers along the riverfront and provided the essential human power to keep the cotton sugar and other goods flowing In examining one diverse group of workers the 10 000 to 15 000 cotton screwmen longshoremen cotton and round freight teamsters cotton yardmen railroad freight handlers and Mississippi River roustabouts this book focuses primarily on the workplace and the labor movement that emerged along the waterfront From the preface

Lincoln and Black Freedom LaWanda Cox, 2021-05-10 Reveals the political savvy and egalitarian convictions behind Lincoln's racial policies In the midst of America's civil rights movement historians questioned the widely held belief that Abraham Lincoln was the Great Emancipator They pictured him as a white supremacist moved by political expediency to issue the Emancipation Proclamation In *Lincoln and Black Freedom* LaWanda Cox a leading Reconstruction historian argues that Lincoln was a consistent friend of African American freedom but a friend whose oblique leadership style often obscured the strength of his commitment Cox reveals Lincoln's cautious rhetoric and policies as deliberate strategy to achieve his joint goals of union and emancipation and she demonstrates that his wartime reconstruction efforts in Louisiana moved beyond a limited concept of freedom for the former slaves Cox's final chapter explores the limits of the possible concluding that had Lincoln lived through his second term the conflict between his successor and Congress could have been avoided and the postwar Reconstruction might have resulted in a more lasting measure of justice and equality for African Americans Lincoln emerges from Cox's study as a masterful politician whose sure grasp of the nature of presidential leadership speaks not only to the difficulties of his age but also to the challenges of our own time

Labbé, Jonathan Lurie, 2005 While ruling that Louisiana had legitimately exercised its powers the Court's majority went much further to declare that the amendment and its due process and equal protection clauses applied exclusively to the plight of former slaves and thus were unavailable to any other American
