material what his titanesque soul felt what his sculptor s imagination saw but what sculpture refused him Thus this admirable sculptor became the creator at the Vatican of the most lyrical and epic decoration ever seen the Sistine Chapel The profusion of his invention is spread over this vast area of over 900 square metres. There are 343 principal figures of prodigious variety of expression many of colossal size and in addition a great number of subsidiary ones introduced for decorative effect.
